We love Vegas because it's over-the-top! Where else can you visit Venice for a Gondola ride....







....& go up the Eiffel Tower; & exult in the glory of ancient Rome (Cæsar would be proud!)....



....and watch dancing fountains shoot into the night....




....and see a volcano explode into flames once an hour? Gotta love it! But Vegas is also the gateway to the fantastic natural beauty of the Southwest...

Leaving civilization for the wilderness! To the mountains!






Entering Utah - now, THAT is MY kind of speed limit!

"Limber pines" cling to life on the rocks




Folks can hike down through the canyon, about 1.5 hours.

....and this fountain that bursts into flames every hour re-enacting the fall of Atlantis!




Even the ceilings are works of art!



Las Vegas is also a celebration of fantastic shows.


Continuing our celebration, the next night we went to Criss Angel's "MindFreak" magic show.


After almost 2 hours of illusion, slight-of-hand, levitation, bright lights and loud music —




our minds were totally freaked! It was awesome.

Over-the-top, but totally worth it!







We go totally outside our comfort zone at "Machine Guns Vegas", where you can shoot stuff!



We are non-violent people & have never fired a weapon before, but a friend said we had to try it — where else can you fire a real machine gun? — so, hey, another YOLO moment!








Judy gets instruction on the Glock handgun: Ready, Aim, FIRE!





The name is.... Bond.... James Bond.... (cue the music....)






I really wanted to try the semi-automatic sniper rifle, like the Gray Man.


We decided to go for broke with Giada's 4-course all-inclusive special "Tasting Menu".
